



The Vestry and sabbatical team, which is currently being formed by Junior Warden Peter Fairman, thought it wise to have Mother Libby come and preach and get to know St. Mark's a little in advance of the sabbatical. Fr. Peter will be at church that day as well. So come on the 12<sup>th</sup> and get to know Mother Libby and show her the warmth and love and welcome which is such an important part of our parish community.

## ST. MARK'S CHURCH TO WELCOME THE REV. DEACON ERIC ELLEY AS OUR NEWEST CLERGY PERSON

St. Mark's is welcoming a new ordained leader into our life, the Rev. Eric Elley! Eric is known to a number of us already as he is actively involved in Church without Walls, Big Blue (the homeless ministry in Springfield), and offering audio visual support at Diocesan Convention.

Bishop Fisher has invited St. Mark's to welcome a deacon into our parish life. Deacons are a specific order in the church who represent the church to the world and the needs of the world to the Church. At Sunday services they have specific rolls, they read the Gospel, they prepare the Table for Holy Communion, they assist in administering the Eucharist, they dismiss the people to head into the world to love and serve God. They also take part in pastoral care and other worship rolls. Ultimately, Deacons serve at the direction of the Bishop and do not receive a salary for their ministry.

Prior to being at St. Mark's Deacon Eric served at St. Andrew's Church in Longmeadow. He is currently in the process of pursuing ordination to the Priesthood, and as such he will be undergoing additional formation here at St. Mark's prior to his potential priestly ordination.

We are looking forward to having Eric join us in 2020. As a way of getting to know Eric a little bit before his arrival, please read his brief biography below.



Born and raised in New Jersey, Eric and his husband Graham are happy to call Somers, Connecticut their home. They, along with their son Jeffrey, and very pampered pooch Chester, live in the parsonage (or rectory in Episcopal-speak) next to the Congregational Church of Somersville (UCC) where Graham has served as pastor since 2005.

Trained originally in electronics engineering, Eric worked in the electronics and IT industries for several years and continues to operate a business in multiple segments of that field. He was ordained a deacon in the Episcopal Church USA in 2000. He served at Trinity Cathedral and was employed on bishop's staff in the Diocese of New Jersey for five years. Since moving to New England in 2005 for

Graham's call, Eric served as a Deacon at St. John's Episcopal Church in Northampton for seven years, inaugurating their very successful midnight breakfast program for Smith College students.




## Bement Waterfield Grant Applications for March 2020


Friends and colleagues,
