THE WAY OF LOVE: FROM ACTIONS TO WORDS—LEARN—SUNDAY, JUNE 2,11:30AM

Have you ever wondered what in the world is going on at St. Mark's on Sundays after the 10am service finishes? Suddenly an entirely different church, made up of Bhutanese refugees, gathers in the sanctuary, singing songs and praying to God in an entirely different language (and with drums!). What's going on?

Come and learn...

what it's like to be a refugee driven from your homeland and placed in a resettlement camp.

how these church members came to be Christians instead of Buddhists

why they were resettled in Springfield, MA

what sort of food they eat (we will share a common meal of both "American" and Nepali food)

how we both worship the same God using different words and songs (we will teach each other a song we use in our worship)

As part of our hourlong gathering we will also bless the Rainbow Community Garden.

Parents/Grandparents/Guardians: We will be providing child programming and childcare in the nursery.

There is no cost for this meal, just sign up ahead of time in the Great Hall or by emailing Fr. Peter (rector@stmarksma.org) so we have a head count.

ROSEBUD MISSION NEWS



St. Mark's team of 12 missioners is getting ready for our mission trip to Rosebud Indian Reservation in South Dakota this summer (July 1-10). We have met seven times so far to plan, learn, share, pray, and learn about the work we will be doing in South Dakota. We are excited to see how God will call us to serve and love our sisters and brothers who live in the Reservation under the guidance of the local Episcopal priest, the Rev. Dr. Lauren Stanley.



Thanks to St. Mark's and the broader community the mission team gathered over 11,600 POUNDS of clothing and other household goods. This incredible amount of donated items helped raise roughly 2,400 dollars for the Rosebud Mission.

Additionally, many of you have been pre-ordering T-shirts, sweatshirts and water bottles. Every item sold will go towards our mission to rebuild the Rosebud community which was decimated by blizzards and flooding this past year.

Also keep your eyes open in the Great Hall to learn about other ways you can pray for and support our team as we head forth in the Name of Christ. (*Hint, check out page 6*)

Minutes of the April 23, 2019 Meeting

St. Mark's Vestry

Present: Fr. Peter Swarr, Rob Fitzpatrick, Claire Sygiel, Peter Fairman, Ellie Otto, Rich Bruns, Scott Conrad, Nancy LaBrie, Jon Robichaud, and Jake Berry.

The meeting was called to order with an opening prayer at 7:00 p.m.

Vestry reflected on what it would look like to "welcome all" to our church. Some of the thoughts were we would have announcements, more church services, and bereavement/divorce support groups. Some of the other suggestions that were made, Fr. Peter noted that the Welcome Ministry Team is already working on such as designated greeters at the door, welcome bags to be distributed to newcomers, and protocol for follow up. Fr. Peter read from the Gospel of St. Luke about the Good Shepherd who not only protects his own sheep but also goes out searching for other flocks and gathers them together.

In response to a question by Nancy of how do we know if someone is new, Fr. Peter said there is a mechanism in place whereby members of the welcome team touch base with Fr. Peter during the peace to identify newcomers and someone is designated to wait for them at the door to welcome them and invite them to Holy Grounds if they seem receptive.

Rob made a motion, seconded by Peter F., to accept the March minutes as submitted. The motion carried unanimously.

Vestry members reviewed the information sheet about various activities in the parish. Fr. Peter noted that, as part of the Stations of the Cross on Good Friday, members of Christ Church Cathedral visited the homeless encampments in Springfield and distributed 60 pair of the Bombas socks.

Vestry went into executive session and then resumed the meeting with a discussion of the gift of \$12,000 that we received from an anonymous donor. Fr. Peter noted that the only restriction on this gift was that at least ten percent be used for outreach ministry. He also reported that last Saturday Mary L'Heureux donated \$2,000 to be used to reduce our line of credit. After much discussion on how best to use the \$12,000 donation, a motion was made by Jon, seconded by Rob and approved unanimously to use the money as follows:

- \$1,500 to outreach, distribution to be determined by the Outreach Ministry team, with the suggestion that some be allocated for Big Blue and some to the Rosebud Reservation mission trip;
- \$2,000 to repair the door at the rectory, which is estimated to cost approximately \$2,800, the remaining \$800 needed would come from the Buildings & Egounds budget;
- \$1,000 to fund Vacation Bible School as 18 people have volunteered to work at the summer program;
- \$3,000 to replace the lighting in the sanctuary with LED bulbs that will allow us to keep the dimmers. We will have to do the work ourselves but will see savings on our electric bill immediately;
- \$1,000 to upgrade the network that is so slow that many times it takes close to 18 minutes for computers in the office to boot up. Rob Mitus, Rob F. and Eric Elley have volunteered to get this done;
- \$2,000 to reduce the line of credit:
- \$1,500 to be left in reserve.

Scott suggested we might publicize Mary's gift of \$2,000 and the \$2,000 allocated from the anonymous gift going to reduce the line of credit and ask if anyone would like to join in this momentum with a matching gift. Scott, Claire and Sue will work on how best to present this to the congregation.

Fr. Peter asked for thoughts on the above statement of welcome that has been created by the Episcopal Church. Vestry members agreed that it fits in very well with our own statement of "Christ welcomed all, we welcome you" and the suggestion was made to add our lines to the statement and have a banner made to hang outside the front of the church, particularly across the two front doors. In response to what concerns we might have with this statement of

welcome, Nancy noted that older parishioners might have a better reaction to this statement than they would to a plain rainbow flag as was previously discussed by vestry. Peter F noted that the statement of welcome was printed in last Sunday's bulletin. Fr. Peter made a motion, seconded by Jake, to move forward with the statement. The motion carried unanimously.

Under Updates, Scott reported that no finance committee meeting was held last month but that he is continuing to make sure that all monies are flowing in and out of the correct accounts. Jon noted that the \$1,500 to be held in reserve from the anonymous gift should help with cash flow. Scott noted that his name has still not been put on the line of credit despite his efforts and he will continue to work on that. He will be scheduling the audit soon.

Jon updated the vestry on Buildings & Drounds activities; noting that donations were made to build two more storage units in the lower level and that the one housing the tools given by Scott's father is now complete and the tools are secure. A railing has been added around the sump pump for safety reasons. Spring cleanup is scheduled for April 28. Nancy offered to help

Marj Bruns with the gardens and Ellie offered to do any painting needed for the new rectory door installation.

Fr. Peter reported that the Diocese has contributed \$4,400 to the Rosebud Reservation mission trip and that we have submitted a grant proposal for \$4,000 to St. John's Church in Williamstown. The mission group continues to meet every other week and upcoming fundraisers include the Savers clothing drive, St. Mark's T-shirt, sweatshirt, and water bottle sale, and an opportunity for parishioners to "purchase miles" at one dollar a mile to cover the 3,800 miles between East Longmeadow and the reservation. A mural will be created to show exactly where Rosebud is located.

A discussion was held about a proposed ECL funded Christian Education Admin and Special Event position. Fr. Peter explained that the \$10,000 given to him and Sue for their work with the Christian Leadership Program would be used to fund this part time, one-year position at St. Mark's. A job description has been created and Fr. Peter noted that in accordance with vestry policy, parishioners will not be considered for the position. A suggestion was made that perhaps two church school teachers, a parent and a vestry member could form a small ad hoc search committee. Peter F volunteered to serve as the vestry representative. Scott noted that perhaps the curriculum that will be developed could be then used in subsequent years. He also suggested that due to our projected deficit, we make clear to the congregation that this position is not being funded by St. Mark's.

Under Quick Action items, Fr. Peter noted that two Way of Love Words to Actions events are coming up. On May 11, there will be an opportunity to Worship at the Celtic Service at St. Andrew's Church in Longmeadow followed by dinner at an area restaurant. Participants will meet at St. Mark's at 4:15 p.m.

On June 2, we are invited to share a communal meal with the Salvation Church at 11:30 a.m. and Learn about the Nepali people and how they came to relocate in East Longmeadow. Funds left over from the Rainbow Garden Fund will be used for the meal.

Then in July, we will be Blessed by completing small projects that older parishioners and others may need in their homes. And then in August, we will Go out into the community and worship with those at Church Without Walls, prepare and serve a hot meal at Loaves & Description of the community and worship with those at Church Without Walls, prepare and serve a hot meal at Loaves & Description of the church at Rolling Ridge. Sue will be at church at 8:45 a.m. this Sunday to chat with the early comers about goings-on at the church if anyone would like to join her.

Fr. Peter updated the vestry on pastoral concerns.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:57 p.m.
