STEWARDS OF THE EPISCOPAL CHURCH

As our Presiding Bishop Michael Curry likes to say; "We are the Episcopal branch of the Jesus Movement". Well our branch has been very active recently. I've been following some of the news from General Convention #79 and it has made me feel very humble. General Convention occurs every three years and is the body that shapes our church and its future. This time around it is happening in Austin, TX. Each Diocese within the worldwide Episcopal Church (not to be confused with the worldwide Anglican Communion of which we are a part) sends elected deputies to Convention. Deputies are elected locally at each Diocesan Convention which, for the Diocese of Western Mass occurs every October. There are clergy and lay deputies who make up the House of Deputies and then there are the diocesan bishops who make up the House of Bishops. That's the background info but that's not what has made me feel humble.

It's the depth of faith, commitment, and hard work these deputies display and the broad and serious nature of the topics addressed that give me pause. Here are just two of the headlines from Convention: "General Convention moves one step closer toward sacramental marriage equality; House of Bishops must act on 'compromise' resolution", and "Deputies back plan to end financial complicity in Israel's occupation of Palestinian lands". One deals with the core of our church – its liturgy, and the other with our social responsibility in the world. Woah.

These faithful deputies are truly stewarding this church that I love. They are lovingly caring for our faith, our traditions, and our social conscience while shepherding us to a new place. The Episcopal Church never comes out of General Convention the same. And isn't that what God expects of us? We are meant to grow and evolve in our understanding of God's creation. That's pretty humbling. I'm grateful to, and humbled by, these ordinary people who have accepted our expectations to be the stewards of our church.
