#### MEET OUR NEW MINISTER OF MUSIC



Greetings to all my new friends at St. Mark's! I am so thankful and excited to be joining you as minister of music. Let me tell you a little bit about myself.

I grew up in Nyack, NY, attending Grace Episcopal Church, where my father and brother are still active members. As a child and teen, I belonged to the Junior Choir and the EYF, and attended diocesan youth conferences every summer. My years at Grace Church left a deep imprint on me, and ever since, I have longed to find a church where my soul would be fed in the way it was there. I have been at all sorts of other churches since then - including eighteen years in the Catholic church in Japan (where all my children were born), and most recently nine years as the music director at the Second Congregational Church of Williamstown, preceded by five years as the youth music director at the First United Methodist Church of Williamstown.

On the last Sunday of this June, my husband Kevin Combs and I visited St. Mark's. I was so moved by what I experienced - the sense of wonder and worship, the "aliveness," the warm welcome, Father Peter's inspiring message, Nancy and the choir's beautiful music (we had happened upon her last Sunday).... It was love at first sight. Immediately I thought, "If only I could be part of a church like this!"

Now that wish and the prayers of my heart have been answered, and I am so grateful!

This change coincides with another big change in my life - Kevin and I, along with my daughter Maki (a soprano and music teacher), her husband Anderson (a Brazilian clarinetist), and their toddler Mollie (who speaks English, Japanese, and Portuguese!), are in the process of purchasing a house in Conway, where we will all move in together some time later this month.

I have two other children: my youngest, Sato, is at Juilliard studying composition and violin. My eldest, Yo, is a freelance translator who lives near my parents in the lower Hudson valley. He is married to Cindy, who came with him from the Philippines almost two years ago. She is a mechanical engineer. My family looks like a miniature United Nations.

Other interesting bits of information about me: I am a school music teacher (at Sunderland Elementary School) and an author of Japanese children's books and songs. As well as piano and organ, I play fiddle in a folk band (with Kevin on autoharp), guitar (which I have often played in worship), and various other instruments, including some medieval ones. As a school music teacher, I have taught most band and string instruments. Kevin, who can be recognized by his big beard, is a metal craftsman at Period Lighting Fixtures, where he creates beautiful reproductions of Colonial chande-liers, sconces, and lanterns.

I am so looking forward to getting to know all of you, and to worshiping with you. Thank you so much for your warm welcome!
